I wrote to Tonzu and they provided lots of free vegan sausages for the BBQ. I wrote to The Vegetarian Butcher and they provided many free vegan food items for the BBQ helpers after the clean-up.

Over 200 people came to the beach clean-up and we cleared 200kg of rubbish off the beach. It was so successful that now I have a big database of people to help me with more clean ups. I held a vegan BBQ afterwards for the helpers, it was important to me that it was vegan so no animals would be hurt for the sake of a BBQ. I loved the positive feedback about the food and had lots of people asking where to buy this vegan food too.

I also gave a speech at the start of the Beach cleanup about my reasons for holding it and why change is needed.

As a result of my clean up I was asked to be a speaker for a Girl Guides and Brownies event dinner so I told everyone about how I am vegan and things they can do to help our planet. I also wanted to inspire other young people that no matter how old they are they can get out there and make a difference.

I was also trained by Sustainable Coastlines after my clean up so I can map data and add it to their website. I spent a day with them cleaning Monaco and The Glen in Nelson learning from them.

Ministry of Inspiration have asked me to be a Youth Leader and I also received a letter from Jacinda Ardern which was very exciting.
